A famous interpreter from the land of "Tous" (Mirzam Mohammad Mashhadi's biography and his Tebayan's interpretation)

Abstract

"Mirza Mohammad ibn Mohammad Reza Qummi Mashhadi" (Died about 1125 AH) is a scholar of the Safavid period (12th century AH) and master of famous interpretation "Kanz aldqayeq va Bahr alghrayb". He has left numerous works in the fields of Quran, jurisprudence and theology. The main characteristic of the author's era, is the movement of Persian language and dominance of predicative approach and occurrence of narrative interpretations and works. Mirza Mohammad Mashhadi in line with this scientific and cultural approach, produces two narrative interpretations of "Tebyan-e Soleimani" in pershian and "Kanz aldqayeq va Bahr alghrayb" in Arabic. In this paper, providing a brief biography of the interpreter, we will introduce the interpretation of "Tebyan-e Soleimani" and the commentator interpretive style. And we will have an overview in the manuscripts of the commentary.
