

Investigating the Relationship between Social Capital and Marital Satisfaction in Birjand

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Abstract

Marital satisfaction is a very important and fundamental factor for family stability. In recent years the unprecedented increase in divorce rate in Birjand indicates high weaknesses of families and changes in marital life style. The purpose of this survey is to explain the marital satisfaction in of Brigands' couples in 2018. This article seeks to find a reason for reducing marital satisfaction in the city of Birjand. The theoretical framework of this research is based on the theory of social capital by James colman lane and Bradbury Fincham and phenol. The research method of this study is survey and the statistical population of this study is households in the city of Birjand. Findings indicate that marital satisfaction increases by 0/47 for each unit of change in social capital of inter-group and in exchange for each unit of change in social capital of structural inter-group marital satisfaction increases by 0/34. In general 59% of marital satisfaction changes are explained by the main variables of social capital within a structural inter-group and cognitive inter-group. The results of the research is that social capital of inter-group does not have an important effect on the satisfaction of couples but the changes that have been made within the structure of the family and between couples are more important. Model fit tests show that the model is good for this study so this model can be generalized from the sample to statistical society. Finally the value is 0/95 kmo and the appropriate amount of Bartletts test at a significant level of 0.000 indicates the fitting of the research model and the ability to generalize the factorized sample into Research population.
