
Investigating the Relationship between Cost-Reward and Sense of Social Justice with Social Indifference among Students (Case study: Payame Noor University of Mashhad)

Abstract

In sociological texts, often indifference as a pathological phenomenon is an obstacle to political and social participation, an obstacle to national development, and also to the complications of urbanization in the modern age. Social apathy is a kind of cynical perception, a sense of suspicion and, in other words, a kind of social depression. Hence, from a psychological point of view, it is a type of social disease. Therefore, the importance of studying social indifference and its inappropriate consequences on the path to development is necessary. The general objective of this research is to determine the degree of social apathy and its effective factors among students of Payame Noor University of Mashhad. This study was conducted using a survey method and a questionnaire tool. The research community was composed of students of Payame Noor University of Mashhad (13595 people). The sample size was 373 persons based on proportional random sampling method. The results of the hypotheses are that there is a significant relationship between independent variables, cost-reward analysis with social indifference variable, and there is not a meaningful relationship between the sense of social justice and social indifference. In the results of multiple regression analysis, it has been determined that about% 0.18 of changes in social apathy can be explained by independent variable.
